

## APRIL SPOTLIGHT

Bob Dykstra was born in 1930 in a farmhouse in Wood County, Wisconsin. Literally, *born* in the farmhouse. One of 10 children (8 boys and 2 girls), Bob was given no middle name. When pushed why, he tells me "My parents were concerned about running out of names with that many children."

When Bob was 11, he moved to rural Sheboygen County, WI. The first in his family to attend high school, he went to Normal school (a teacher preparation system feeding into the then-one-roomschoolhouses of rural Wisconsin) and taught briefly before being drafted in the Army in 1952. While stationed in Fort Riley, Kansas, Bob sang barbershop as part of the recruiting program for the US Army. This love of and involvement in barbershop quartets would be a continuing hallmark of Bob's social & musical engagement for years to come.

Leaving the Army in 1954, Bob found himself back in the classroom until 1955. Lured by the fame and fortune awaiting barbershop quartets in the Minneapolis / St. Paul areas, he relocated to the "big city" and has called The Twin Cities 'home' since then. Bob earned his master's and Ph.D. degree in Education at the U of M, and worked as a Professor for the esteemed School of Education at the University of Minnesota.

Bob's 2 most prominent singing groups were The Salty Dogs and The Hut Four, and his involvement with barbershop quartets did not stop once he got married. His wife was an accomplished barbershopper as well, her own quartet winning the 1982 International Sweet Adeline Quartet Competition. Bob and his wife were married for 60 years before her passing in 2018, and their 3 children (Kim, Paul,
